



# Sleepy Time Satin Bonnet

Stitch a comfy satin bonnet to protect your hair from damage while sleeping, or to use as a scrub cap to keep your hair contained.

### Supplies

- 19" square of two satin fabrics
- 5"x70" rectangle of knit fabric

1. Fold each square in half, then in half the other way. From the corner, measure 9" in an arc; cut out.
2. Stack the circles with right sides together. Fold in half. Mark the fold 3" from the raw edges, and 2" along the raw edges. Connect the marks and cut out the wedge. Unfold the circles.
3. Stitch the V using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ "- $\frac{3}{8}$ " seam allowance. Clip into the corner. Turn the circles right side out and press the seam.
4. Fold the circles in half, matching the finished edges and mark the center on the opposite raw edge.
5. Baste the circle perimeter, beginning and ending at the finished opening, using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ "- $\frac{3}{8}$ " seam allowance. Set aside.
6. Using a flexible measuring tape, measure your head circumference at the base of your hair; subtract 2". Mark this measurement centered on the knit rectangle.
7. Fold the knit rectangle in half lengthwise with right sides together. Stitch the edges using a stretch stitch and a  $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance, leaving the head measurement open. Clip the corners.
8. Gather the basting thread so the bonnet edge matches the opening left in the knit rectangle. Align the bonnet with one knit raw edge with right sides together. Stitch using a stretch stitch. Turn each side of the tie right side out.
9. Fold the remaining knit raw edge over the previous stitching line. Topstitch using a stretch stitch.
